# For all the victims of gun violence, known and unknown, especially Brian, Arielle, and Alex.

### Bishop PerryBlessed be God: Creator, Christ and Holy SpiritPeopleAnd blessed be God's kingdom, now and for ever. Amen.

As the procession begins, the cantors now sing Psalm 22:1-11 Deus, Deus meu

MY God, my God, why have you forsaken me? \* and are so far from my cry and from the words of my distress? O my God, I cry in the daytime, but you do not answer; \* by night as well, but I find no rest.

3 Yet you are the Holy One, \* enthroned upon the praises of Israel.

- 4 Our forefathers put their trust in you; \* they trusted, and you delivered them.
- 5 They cried out to you and were delivered; \* they trusted in you and were not put to shame.
- 6 But as for me, I am a worm and no man, \* scorned by all and despised by the people.
- 7 All who see me laugh me to scorn; \* they curl their lips and wag their heads, saying,
- 8 "He trusted in the LORD; let him deliver him; \* let him rescue him, if he delights in him."
- 9 Yet you are he who took me out of the womb, \* and kept me safe upon my mother's breast.
- 10 I have been entrusted to you ever since I was born; \* you were my God when I was still in my mother's womb.
- 11 Be not far from me, for trouble is near, \* and there is none to help.

### Bishop Perry then says the Prayer for Light, first saying Let us pray.

LIGHTEN our darkness, we beseech you, O Lord; and by your great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; for the love of your only Son, our Savior, Jesus Christ. *Amen.* 

ALMIGHTY and most merciful God, kindle within us the fire of love, that by its cleansing flame we may be made worthy to worship you in spirit and in truth; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

The candles at the Altar are now lighted, as are other candles and lamps as may be convenient. During the candle-lighting, silence is kept.


