One of his most important efforts was an organ recital of Bach's music given in St. Thomas Church, Leipzig in 1840 where Bach had been Kantor from 1723-1750. Jeremy David Tarrant recreates this program on the Cathedral's grand pipe organ. The audience will be able to see the organist in action via large screen.
