## Cathedral Staff Update

David Heinze has been appointed as our new Associate Organist and Succentor. A native of Grand Rapids, Mr. Heinze has most recently served as Music Director and Organist of Christ Church (Episcopal), Bronxville, New York, and prior to that appointment was Associate Organist and Director of Music and Organist of Grace Church, Providence, Rhode Island. He is a graduate of the Interlochen Arts Academy and Hope College, and earned the Master of Music degree from the University of Cambridge, where he was Assistant Organist of Selwyn College. In August 2025 he earned the Fellowship Diploma of the Royal College of Organists.

Here at the Cathedral Mr. Henze will assist Canon Tarrant in all areas of our music ministry and the Cathedral Choir School. In a bipartite role he will also, as Succentor, coordinate all Cathedral communications and technology, and will assist Dean Alsay and Canon Tarrant in liturgical planning and training. While his official start date is June 15, he will be with us for all services next Sunday, May 3.

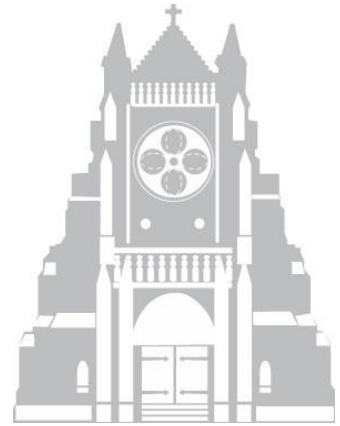
*Welcome!* Our vision is to be an extraordinary spiritual gathering place where people of all backgrounds and ages are welcome to question and learn, pray, worship and serve; being loved by God in ways that change and improve their lives and the lives of others.

*Visitors* are encouraged to fill out a Cathedral Connection sheet included with your bulletin and place it in the offering plate. Please ask a clergy person or usher if you have questions. All are welcome—if you are looking for a church home, you have one here.

*About Receiving Communion* – Please know that this is God’s table and any person seeking to be fed from it will not be turned away. To receive the consecrated bread, extend your hands and it will be placed in your palm. Should you choose to receive the consecrated wine, you may guide the chalice gently to your mouth taking a small sip. Those desiring gluten-free Communion should ask the clergy when coming forward for Communion.

Anyone may come forward at the time of Communion and receive the blessing instead, by crossing your arms across your chest. When returning to your seat after making your communion, please return to your pew by using the side aisles. At 11:00 a.m., Communion is offered at the High Altar, and in Grace Chapel, a barrier-free location to the left of the pulpit. Prayers for healing, for you or another, are offered in the Chapel of the Intercession (at the front of the Cathedral on the right-hand side) during Communion.

*About Children and Worship* – Jesus said, “Let the little children come to me, for to them belongs the Kingdom of God.” We believe that the place of a child is in worship in the Cathedral. We hope you will help them follow the service, sing the hymns, and use the bulletin and Prayerbook. At the back of Grace Chapel, there is a soft space available. If you feel the need to step out, we have space in the Parlor which has the livestream of the service, so you can follow along that way.
